Saturday, May 9, 2009, at 3:00 PM at the Melbourne Public Library, 540 E. Fee Ave., Melbourne, the South Brevard Historical Society presents Dr. Ben Brotemarkle, the new director of the Florida Historical Society, who will be talking about the history and programs of the FHS. The Society, established in 1856 in St Augustine, is the oldest cultural organization in Florida and the only state-wide historical society. The Society operates the FHS Press, maintains the Library of Florida History at its headquarters in Cocoa Village, and manages the Historic Rossetter House Museum in the old Eau Gallie section of Melbourne. FHS publishes scholarly research in its *Florida Historical Quarterly*, produces a weekly radio program, *Florida Frontiers*, presents other educational programs, and holds its annual meeting in May.

Brotemarkle, a member of the Brevard County Historical Commission, is author of several books: *Beyond the Theme Parks: Exploring Central Florida*; *Images of America: Titusville and Mims*; *Barberville*; and *Crossing Division Street: An Oral History of the African American Community in Orlando*. He is Professor of Humanities at Brevard Community College, producer /host of *Florida*, and he has produced and hosted television documentaries, including *A Legacy of Hope: The Moore Heritage Festival of the Arts and Humanities*.

May 28th, 2009--Smyrna: Lost and Found with Special Discussant - Local Historian Dot Moore. Explore the archaeology and history of the Turnbull Plantation (located in present day New Smyrna). This 1770's plantation was a large scale economic venture by Andrew Turnbull that ended in failure but brought a large number of Minorcans to Florida's First Coast.

June 25th, 2009--Journey into Wilderness: Florida's Indian River Lagoon with Special Discussant - Florida Historian and FHS Executive Director Dr. Ben Brotemarkle

Ever wonder what Florida's Space Coast was like before NASA? Join us as we delve into the vast history of Indian River Lagoon. From early Spanish explorers who expanded the European frontier to the American astronauts who expanded the human frontier into space and all the railroads and citrus ventures in between.

July 23rd, 2009--Shadows and Reflections: Florida's Lost People Follow Florida artist Ted Morris as he attempts to understand what the first peoples of Florida were really like. In order to portray the images of Florida Indians, Morris visits several key prehistoric Florida sites and talks to key Florida archaeologists. Sites include a Paleo-Indian site on the Aucilla River and several sites from European contact. Native groups include the Calusa, Apalachee, Timucua, and Tequesta.

Florida Frontiers: The Weekly Radio Magazine of the Florida Historical Society is a weekly, half-hour radio program airing on public radio stations throughout the state. It can be heard of WMFE, 90.7 on Thursdays, 6:30 pm, and on WFIT, 89.5 Sundays at 7 am.
