**AN INFAMOUS CRIME**

On the morning of December 9 1955, the residents of tiny Melbourne would awaken to the news of a brutal murder the night before. Soon Philip Van Eeghen would go on trial for the double homicide of his wife and daughter. The murders and their aftermath would rock the little town of Melbourne and the nation. For months, local and national newspapers screamed out every detail of the trial right up to his 1958 conviction. From the New York Times to the Melbourne Daily Times, it was a sensation.

When he was finally convicted, Van Eeghen was sentenced to life at Raiford, Florida's State Prison. After only 13 years, he escaped and was not found for 8 years. Unbelievably, only one year after his capture, he was paroled. What a miscarriage of justice! How could he be paroled after escaping and serving such a short time?

Was he really the murderer? How was he convicted with no motive and no murder weapon or did the police have the weapon and was there a motive they overlooked?

Was he guilty of the brutal death of his son the year before or was it an accident as he claimed?

Come and find out about Melbourne's crime of the century which rivals the O.J. Simpson trial and the Jon Benet murder. It remains a mystery after 55 years and still baffles and fascinates us today.

This fascinating program will be presented by Ann Raley Flotte. Ann researches and writes about local history and is the secretary of the SBHS. She and her sister Karen Raley are co-authors of "Images of America, Melbourne and Eau Gallie".

### NEW HISTORIC MARKER IN SOUTH BREVARD

The location of the first house in what was known as Melbourne Beach has been designated a FLORIDA HERITAGE SITE.. A new hisitoric marker dedicated in May commemorates Myrtle Cottage built in 1888 by Mrs. Hannah Cummings and her daughter Grace. The site is located on Ocean Avenue to the east of the Community Chapel.

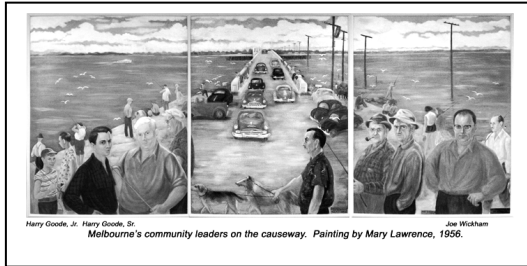
Historic Markers are sponsored by the Brevard County Historical Commission, the Brevard County Tourist Development Council, and the Florida Department of State.
